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Philosophy and Approach: I believe that counseling is a collaborative approach between a counselor and a client; a process in which a patient needs to be supported in identifying areas in his or her life that need to be changed to reach a healthier level of functioning. I utilize an approach that emphasizes working with a client's motivation to change (including Person Centered, Motivational Interviewing and Cognitive-Behavioral therapies).

Formal Education and Training: I hold a Master's Degree in Counseling Psychology from Lewis and Clark College. Major coursework included: Diagnosis and Treatment of Adult Disorders, Lifespan Development, Cultural Diversity, Group Counseling with Adults, Models of Addiction Recovery, Family Counseling and Couples Counseling.

As a licensee of the Oregon State Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists, I will abide by its code of ethics. To maintain my license I am required to participate in annual continuing education, taking classes dealing with subjects relevant to this profession. I may substitute professional supervision for part of this requirement.

Fees: Initial evaluations are \$225 for a 75 minute session, individual sessions are \$175 for 55 minute sessions and family/couples sessions are \$210 for 50 minutes.

As a client of an Oregon licensee you have the following rights:

- To expect that a licensee has met the minimal qualifications of training and experience required by state law;
- To examine public records maintained by the Board and to have the Board confirm credentials of a licensee;
- To obtain a copy of the Code of Ethics (Oregon Administrative Rules 833-100);
- To report complaints to the Board;
- To be informed of the cost of professional services before receiving the services;
- To be assured of privacy and confidentiality while receiving services as defined by rule and law, including the following exceptions: 1) Reporting suspected child abuse; 2) Reporting imminent danger to a client or others; 3) Reporting information required in court proceedings or by client's insurance company, or other relevant agencies; 4) Providing information concerning licensee case consultation or supervision; and 5) Defending claims brought by client against licensee.
- To be free from being the object of discrimination on the basis of race, religion, gender, or other unlawful category while receiving services.
